We will be fertilizing, watering and grooming the plants, setting up the sale site with signage, final placement of plants, installing the shade canopies, striping the parking, holding area and check

out lines, etc. and we'll need lots of help on sale day. There are sign up sheets for people to water the plants during the week and numerous jobs on sale day. Volunteer sign up sheets are available on

April 2, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Bob S. Elinor, the V.P. for Programs, emailed that DIG's April 22nd, General Meeting subject will be Firescaping – Landscaping to avert wildfires. Our speaker will be Patrice Hanlon. May's meeting subject will be Butterflies and gardens for butterflies. Ginger gave the Treasurer's report and Chris reported that 102 Members have paid their dues for 2019. Chris added that the Special Ed Class at Deer Valley High School, which had received a DIG donation in 2018 had sent a thank you note. With our donation, the Class was able to

Juli volunteered to utilize her NextDoor for advertising the Sale and suggested that everyone do the same with their neighborhood NextDoor. Robin said that there will be a flyer emailed for members to print and pass out and some available at meetings. She reminded us that the Weeder deadline is this Thursday. Under new business: due to the poor condition of our wagons we will purchase 3 new wagons and new tires and/or foam for old tires on some of the existing wagons. New fertilizing equipment will also be purchased. Bob S. thanked Martin Gates of Odvssev Landscaping in Lodi for donating 1500 - 1 gallon plastic plant cans. The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 PM.

UPCOMING PROGRAMS

Our April 22nd speaker will be Patrice Hanlon, Horticultural Consultant & Educator and writer for Contra Costa Times. She will be discussing Firescaping - Landscaping to avert wildfires. Homes that are built in wildfire-prone areas with the appropriate landscapes can make a significant contribution toward wildfire survival. Patrice has been in the horticultural field since 1978; beginning her horticulture career after studying bio-intensive gardening. She attended Diablo Valley College and received her degree in horticulture. After working for East Bay Regional Park District's Botanical Garden she developed and facilitated garden education and watershed programs for educators with Aquatic Outreach Institute. As Garden Director for The Gardens at Heather Farms she oversaw all operations of the site pertaining to plant design, maintenance, propagation of materials for the sales and gardens. She is on the Board of Markham Regional Arboretum Society and owner of Thyme in the Garden, a program designed to help people facing life-threatening or chronic cancer through connecting with the natural world. Her goal is to Inspire, Transform, and Heal people and landscapes.
