President's Message

I sincerely hope that this month's Weeder finds you all healthy, happy and securely sheltered in your homes! Our world has seen many tragedies in its history, but nothing like the coronavirus pandemic that was first identified in December and now, a short four months later, has spread throughout the entire world. We will survive and thrive once we slow the spread of the virus and develop medications that will protect us from this specific strain of virus. In the meantime, we need to listen to the medical experts and follow the restrictions imposed to help fight this so we can get our lives back to normal as quickly as possible. Unfortunately, the restrictions that have been imposed isolate us from our family, friends, and our normal care free routine. We can't participate in activities like our DIG Propagation, general meetings, lunches, etc.

The DIG Board has been following this situation and has adjusted to the imposed restrictions by conducting our Board meetings via telephone conference calls. We had an emergency Board meeting via conference call on March 19, 2020, immediately following the initial shelter in place mandate that was imposed. This resulted in the cancelation of the March General Meeting and Saturday Propagation work days until further notice. We decided to take a wait and see stance on how this virus emergency would progress before deciding on the status of further General meetings, Propagation, and the Plant Sale. As of March 31st the shelter in place has been extended to at least May 3rd and increased the restrictions. This will prohibit DIG from having our April General Meeting as well as our Saturday morning Propagation work days, which, in turn, significantly impacts our annual Plant Sale scheduled for May 9.

At our regular April 7th conference call Board meeting, the Board canceled the April General Meeting and decided to discuss subsequent General Meetings on a month by month basis. We also discussed a variety of options for the Plant Sale, ranging from canceling the sale this year to changing the date of the sale to later in the year. After weighing the pros and cons of many options the Board determined to cancel this year's Plant Sale on May 9 and plan for our next year's sale. Therefore, there will be no additional Saturday morning propagation work days until the fall when we will begin preparing for next years Sale. We are disappointed, but we need to stay safe and healthy and hope that we can get this pandemic under control and our lives back to a more normal situation. Stay Safe!

Due to the Stay at Home order, the Board unanimously voted to cancel DIG's Plant Sale. A discussion of what to do with the plants ended with a suggestion that would need Peter's permission. An email to members will be sent once the final plan is in place. * Watering of the plants will continue. * Bob S. noted that John Sierra's garden fence project has been put on hold.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:05 PM.

Strawberry Pretzel Jell-O Layers





a three layer dessert with a pretzel crust (Make at least four hours before serving.)

1 1/2 Cups Crushed Pretzels

4 1/2 Tablespoons White Sugar

3/4 Cups Butter, melted

1 Cup White Sugar

2 - 8 ounce packages Cream Cheese

1 - 8 ounce container Frozen Whipped Topping, thawed

1 - 6 ounce package Strawberry Jell-O

2 Cups Boiling Water

1 - 16 ounce package Frozen Strawberries, sliced

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix together the pretzels, 4 1/2 T sugar, and melted butter. Press into the bottom of a 9" x 11" pan. Bake 10 minutes until lightly toasted. Let cool completely.
- 2. In a medium bowl beat the sugar and cream cheese until smooth. Fold in whipped topping. Spread evenly over cooled crust. Refrigerate until set, about 30 minutes.
- 3. In the medium bowl stir together the gelatin and boiling water. Mix in frozen strawberries and stir until thawed. Pour over cream cheese mixture in pan.
- 4. Refrigerate until completely chilled, best overnight.

Billbergia nutans (Queen's Tears) - A vigorous bromeliad that is easy to grow and will readily form clumps of narrow upright bronzy-green rosettes. The nearly tubular 2 feet tall rosettes have one foot long slender leaves with small teeth along the margins. In spring the arching flower stalks carry pink bracts and pendant flowers that have chartreuse green petals edged with royal-blue. Plant in shade in a well-drained organic rich soil and water occasionally. It is reliably hardy to 30-32 degrees F but able to tolerate short duration temperatures much lower.
