PROPAGATION SATURDAYS - 10 AM TO NOON

We meet Saturday mornings at 530 Third St., Brentwood to make cuttings to start plants for our next sale. Bring your clippers and enough plant material to make 30-40 6" cuttings. Remember to water well the night before.

For now we are only working with perennials that need to be rooted. We will wait until the first of the year for plants like geraniums, succulents, and divisions, because they don't need rooting hormone and time in perlite to set roots. They can go straight into soil. You can always start those at home - we have cans you can use, but no soil at the moment. 


MEMBERSHIP

MAHOGANY GLAZED RIBS

2 sides baby back or St. Louis pork ribs, sprinkled with salt early in the day. Cover and refrigerate.

SAUCE

- 1 cup hoisin sauce
- ¾ cup plum sauce
- ½ cup soy sauce
- 1/3 cup cider vinegar
- 1/4 cup dry sherry or Chinese rice wine
- ¼ cup honey
- ½ cup chopped green onions
- 6 cloves minced garlic
- ½ tsp. or more red chili flakes or cayenne pepper

Combine all sauce ingredients in bowl. Cover and chill until needed.

3 hours before serving, grill ribs over high heat for 6-7 minutes per side to brown. Then place browned ribs in large baking pan and cover with foil. Bake ribs at 325 degrees for 2 hours. Then uncover pan, pour about 3/4ths of the sauce over ribs and bake 15-30 min. longer.

Serve with extra sauce and lotsa napkins!
