"GOOD BUGS, BAD BUGS "

Dr. John R. Fike, Master Gardener and Professor Emeritus at UCSF

DIG's February Speaker is Dr. John R. Fike. He will be speaking on "Good Bugs, Bad Bugs."

Dr. Fike is a Professor Emeritus at UCSF and has spent his entire 34-year career on the faculty of UCSF after receiving his undergraduate



degree in Biology in 1970 and his graduate degree 1978 from Colorado State. After retiring, he became active in the Master Gardener program for Contra Costa County. Dr. Fike's passion for biology and his interest in education have been instrumental in his contributions to the Master Gardener organization. One of his goals as a Master Gardener is to introduce more science into the gardening landscape in the hope that people will develop an enhanced perspective and appreciation of the fascinating world around us.

The Master Gardener Program Goals are:

- Promote environmentally responsible and sustainable horticultural practices.
- Reduce fertilizer and pesticide pollutants.
- Protect water quality and quantity.
- Reduce landfill materials.
- Improve soil quality.
- Detect and manage invasive species.
- Protect wild lands and urban areas from destructive fires.

EASY EGGS BENEDICT

About 3/4 lb. thinly sliced Black Forest Ham, each slice cut in half ½ pt. whipping cream

12 oz. shredded Monterey Jack and Cheddar Cheese blend

1 dozen eggs

6 English muffins, split, toasted and placed in warm oven

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray 2 large muffin tins (not cupcake pans) with cooking spray.

Line each cup with 2-3 half slices of ham so that metal cup is covered and egg won't leak through. Break an egg into each cup.



Add 1 Tbsp. cream and about 1 heaping tablespoon cheeses to each cup. (Be sure to put water in any empty cups or pan will burn.) Bake 12-15 min.

Serve each portion on a toasted muffin.

Immediately spoon 1-2 tablespoons of Hollandaise sauce over each serving.

While eggs are baking, make the sauce.

Hollandaise Sauce - Makes 1 cup or enough for about 8 servings

1/3 cup egg product (or real eggs, beaten)

2 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice

1 Tbsp. Grey Poupon mustard

1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper (Don't worry – it's not hot at all.)

1 stick butter, melted and kept warm on stove

Place first 4 ingredients in a blender. Cover with lid; blend on medium speed until mixed. Then on low speed, very gradually pour <u>hot</u> butter through feed tube in blender lid until mixture is well blended and thickens. You can keep the sauce warm for 20 min. or so by placing mixture in a 2 cup Pyrex container and placing container in a pan of hot, but not boiling, water. If mixture locks up, add a tiny amount of boiling water and beat with whisk until it smoothes out.

Leftovers (if any, ha!) can be reheated in microwave on low setting for a few minutes.
