

### OCTOBER 28th SPEAKER

## KIRBY WONG DAFFODILS

Our speaker for our October 28 meeting will be Kirby Fong, a Livermore resident. He was a computer scientist at the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory from 1976 until his retirement in 2007. He'll be speaking to us about daffodils, a flower he became interested in after a neighbor recommended he plant some when he remodeled his yard in the 1980's. His interest in daffodils was heightened in 1989 when the American Daffodil Society held its national show in San



Francisco, and he saw daffodil cultivars bred for show or exhibition. That inspired his continuing interest in trying and showing newer as well as historic daffodils. As many of you are aware, if you show up regularly at an activity, you'll eventually be asked to serve as an officer, and Kirby was asked to become a regional director on the board of the American Daffodil Society in the early 1990's. That led to a series of jobs in the American Daffodil Society as slide programs chairman (before

PowerPoint and personal computers became popular), treasurer, awards chairman, and administrator of media (e.g. PDF and video) programs. He's also chairman for the annual daffodil show in Livermore and has been chairman of the national daffodil shows in 2000, 2007, 2016, and 2024. Another of his hobbies is photography, and he has put that to use by photographing many different cultivars for the American Daffodil Society's online database of named daffodils. You may learn more about the American Daffodil Society on the Internet at daffodilusa.org. The daffodil database is at daffseek.org, and presentation about daffodils is at dafftube.org.

Mr. Fong is going to share daffodil bulbs with the DIG members.





### Aunt Ida's Pressed Cookies

2/3 Cup Butter
2/3 Cup White Sugar + extra
2/3 Cup Brown Sugar
2 Cups Quick Oatmeal
1/2 Cup Finely Chopped Nuts
2 Eggs
1 teaspoon Vanilla
2 Cups Flour
1/2 teaspoon Baking Soda

1 teaspoon Baking Powder

Pre-heat Oven to 325 degrees

1/2 teaspoon Salt



Cream butter then add sugars, oatmeal and nuts.
Blend in eggs and vanilla.
Sift together flour, soda, baking powder and salt.
Mix with other ingredients.
Drop small spoonfuls full of dough on greased cookie sheets.
Dip a flat bottomed glass in the extra sugar, then press dough flat.
(Dampen glass bottom to get the sugar to stick, then twist slightly when flattening dough to keep dough from sticking to the bottom of the glass.)
Bake 10 to 12 minutes. Makes 6

## **Swedish Apple Cake**



Servings: Serves 6-8 Author: Rachael Murray

### **INGREDIENTS**

- ½ cup butter, room temp
- 1<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup sugar
- 2 eaas
- 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla
- 11/2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda

### CARAMEL

- 1 ⅓ cup brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons half & half

- 1 teaspoon salt
- 11/2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 3 cups diced & peeled apples (~2 large apples)
- Optional: 1/4 cup chopped pecans or walnuts
- · 4 tablespoons butter

### **PREPARATION**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F and thoroughly grease a 9-inch springform pan.
- 2. In a small bowl, sift together flour, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg.
- 3. In a large bowl, beat butter and sugar until smooth, then add eggs one at a time, followed by the vanilla
- 4. Slowly mix the dry ingredients into the wet until just combined, then fold in apples and nuts if using.
- 5. Transfer batter to the prepared pan and bake for 35-40 minutes as you prepare the caramel.
- 6. Caramel: when cake has been baking for 30 minutes, start the caramel. Add brown sugar, half & half, and butter to a small saucepan over medium-low heat. Stir often until the mixture is smooth and fully combined, no need to bring to a full boil.
- 7. Remove cake from oven and pour caramel over the top. Return cake to oven for additional 10-15 minutes or until caramel is cracking and cake is cooked through the center.
- 8. Allow cake to cool at least 15 minutes before slicing.
