


I want to thank those members who have helped move pots and tables to the new site. We will be having additional workdays this month to move more of our equipment from the Wolfe's and install temporary

### **PROPAGATION: SEEDS**

We had a meeting on January 7 to distribute seeds and soil. We had about a dozen people claim seeds to start for our sale. From the amount of containers left we don't think you took enough. Feel free to come by and pick up more. They'll be on the front porch if I'm not home. Also, we will try to save the packages to use the pictures for signs.

### **VEGETABLE STEW**

- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 medium carrots, sliced into rounds
- 2 stalks celery, chopped
- 2 medium potatoes, diced
- 1 medium zucchini, chopped
- 1 medium bell pepper, chopped (any color)
- 1 cup green beans, trimmed and cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 cup mushrooms, sliced
- 1 can diced tomatoes
- 4 cups vegetable broth
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried rosemary
- 1 teaspoon smoked paprika
- 2 bay leaves
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 tablespoon soy sauce (optional for added depth)
- 1 cup frozen peas
- 1/4 cup fresh parsley, chopped (for garnish)
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice or vinegar (optional, for a bright finish)

### Instructions

- Heat the olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the chopped onion and cook for about 5 minutes until soft and translucent. Stir in the minced garlic and cook for an additional 1 minute until fragrant.
- Add the carrots, celery, and potatoes to the pot. Cook for 5-7 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- Add the zucchini, bell pepper, mushrooms, and green beans.
   Stir everything together and cook for another 5 minutes.
- Pour in the diced tomatoes (with their juices) and the vegetable broth. Stir in the dried thyme, rosemary, smoked paprika, bay leaves, and soy sauce (if using).
- Bring the stew to a boil, then reduce the heat to low. Cover the pot and simmer for about 30-40 minutes until the vegetables are tender. Stir occasionally to prevent sticking.
- Once the veggies are tender, add the frozen peas and cook for another 5 minutes. Remove the bay leaves. Adjust seasoning with salt, pepper, and a splash of lemon juice or vinegar for brightness.
