

#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



## **Refrigerator Raisin Bran Muffins**

Preheat oven to 400\*

4 cups Raisin Bran Cereal

2 1/2 cups sugar

5 cups flour

5 tsp baking soda

2 tsp salt

4 eggs, beaten

1 cup oil

1quart buttermilk

1 cup raisins, if desired



Mix Bran cereal, sugar, flour, baking soda, and salt. Add eggs, oil and buttermilk. Mix well. Add extra raisins If desired. Batter can be stored in refrigerator for up to 6 weeks in a covered container. Makes 5 dozen muffins. Bake off as many muffins as you like and refrigerate the rest of the batter.

Bake in a 400\* oven for 20 minutes Note, I like to add 2 tsp of pumpkin pie spice to the batter.

# **Pimento Cheese Spread**

1 (16 oz) block extra- sharp Cheddar cheese

1 (8 oz) block mild Cheddar cheese

1 (8 oz) package cream cheese (softened)

2 (7 oz) jars chopped pimentos (drained)

1 (12 oz) jar roasted red bell peppers (finely chopped)

1/4 cup mayonnaise

2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce Dash of ground black pepper

1. Shred Cheddar cheeses.

2. Simply mix the grated cheese mixture in with the remaining ingredients in a large bowl. Be careful to not mush the cheese into a lump, toss as much as you stir it. Chill it overnight before you serve it.
